

**Table 2 – Documents Establishing Identity**

<b>Acceptable Evidence of Identity for Citizens and Nationals who do not provide Tier 1 citizenship documentation (Tier 5)</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood, or other U.S. American Indian/Alaska Native tribal document (acceptable if the document carries a photograph of the applicant or beneficiary, or has other personal identifying information relating to the individual).</li><li>• Driver's license issued by a State or Territory either with a photograph of the individual or other identifying information of the individual such as name, age, sex, race, height, weight or eye color.</li><li>• School identification card with a photograph of the individual</li><li>• U.S. military identification card or draft record</li><li>• Identification card issued by the Federal, State, or local government with the same identifying information included on driver's licenses</li><li>• U.S. Military dependent's identification card</li><li>• Native American Tribal document</li><li>• U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Mariner card</li><li>• For children under 16, a school record may include nursery or daycare records</li> <li>• An affidavit to establish the identity of children under 16 is only acceptable if it is signed under penalty of perjury by a parent or guardian stating the date and place of birth of the child, and cannot be used if an affidavit for citizenship was provided.</li><li>• A U.S. Passport, current or expired, even if issued with limitation</li></ul>
<p><b>NOTE:</b> Expired identity documents are acceptable for proof of identity.</p>
